Commissioner Silva stated that Fire District #1 is bringing up at their meeting tonight getting rid of two pick-up trucks or move them to the joint assets.

<u>Purchasing</u> – Purchasing Agent Gargano reported the following:

 - Silverton Pumper Fire Engine Commissioner Silva sent me three change orders:
 - Change Order #1 is for a total of -\$31,500

- Change Order #2 is for a total of \$60,073
- Change Order #3 is for a total of -\$8,484
- Bringing the total of the truck to \$618,423
- Inspection trips so far are \$3,772.87
- Total cost to date is \$622,195.87 Voter Approval is \$650,000
- o Breathing Air System I received Inspection Reports from Continental stating that they performed the start-ups on the air systems for each firehouse. Are the systems up and running satisfactorily? Commissioner Silva reported that they are having a problem with the turn zip nuts; Continental is to be contacted.
- o Silverton Rescue Truck (new truck):
 - Revised contract and other required paperwork was received from Rosenbauer and forwarded to the attorney for review
 - Received a Rider to the Performance Bond correcting the name and forwarded to the attorney for review

• Quotes:

- Generator for substation Kopp Electric called to inform us that currently the substation generator project must go before both the Planning Board and the Zoning Dept. for approval. However, the Township is expected to eliminate the need to go before the Planning Board by changing the process in two or three weeks. He would like permission to hold up on this until the Township changes the process so that a representative from the Board does not have to attend a Planning Board meeting.

<u>Pleasant Plains report</u> – Chief Magovern reported that the breathing air system is in; they are prepared for the snow storm.

<u>Business Administrator Report</u> – Business Administrator Gargano reported that she is busy working on election tasks, taking care of accounting tasks for beginning of year, doing yearend adjusting entries, and proving out everything for year-end 2017.

Unfinished Business:

Engine Repairs needed on 3051 – Engineer McCann reported that they have been waiting for six months for Continental Fire & Safety to do warranty work on the engine. He reported that they were supposed to replace all the gauges under warranty. He reported that the suction relief valve is leaking, and it failed the pump test. Business Administrator Gargano will contact Continental Fire & Safety.

Resolution

Adoption of Temporary Budget for 2018

WHEREAS, it has become necessary for the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of Toms River, County of Ocean, by resolution, to adopt a temporary budget to make appropriations and to provide for the period between the beginning of the fiscal year,

January 1, 2018 and the adoption of the budget by the legal voters of the fire district, which election is scheduled for February 17, 2018.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it RESOLVED by the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of Toms River, County of Ocean, as follows:

(1) A temporary budget is hereby adopted to be effective from the beginning of the fiscal year as noted above and to be in full force and effect until the adoption of the annual fire district budget as referenced above; the total of the appropriations of the temporary budget to reflect not in excess of 14% of the total of the appropriations made for all purposes in the budget for the preceding fiscal year exclusive of appropriations for interest and debt redemption charges and capital improvements.
