Business Administrator Gargano reported that she had gotten several prices; when the salesmen come out, they were not as knowledgeable as the installers who come out to do the job; once those who did the labor came out, they all advised that guards cannot be put on the gutters on the East side of the building due to their larger commercial size and the manner in which they are affixed to the roof. Commissioner Silva stated that at \$7,017, it was more cost effective to have them cleaned each year. Business Administrator Gargano reported that Bob Blank offered to clean them.
