A regular meeting of the Toms River Fire Commissioners, District No. 2 was called to order at 7:30 p.m. at the Pleasant Plains Firehouse, 40 Clayton Avenue, Toms River, New Jersey. Chairman Geoghegan made the required public statement. NFIRS – Commissioner Bierbaum stated that he received information from DCA that when reports are used for litigation, information is severely lacking; anyone filling out the NFIRS reports should fill in the narrative. Chief Roman stated that the Fire Prevention Bureau fills out the NFIRS reports. Commissioner Bierbaum asked that the reports that the Chiefs fill out be more descriptive.

FISCAL YEAR: January 1, 2020 to December 31, 2020

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget for the Toms River Fire Commissioners District No. 2 (the "Fire District") for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020 has been presented before the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at its open public meeting of December 4, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the budget as introduced is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et. seq.) [Include the following as appropriate: [includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$ allowable amount to be raised by taxations[includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$ appropriation from restricted fund balance to be used as budget revenue]]; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$3,419,207.00, which includes an amount to be raised by taxation of \$2,834,415.00, and Total Appropriations of \$3,419,207.00; and

WHEREAS, the amount to be raised by taxation to support the district budget shall be the amount to be certified to the assessor of the municipality to be assessed against the taxable property in the district, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:14-79. Such amount shall be equal to the amount of the total appropriations set forth in the budget minus the total amount surplus and miscellaneous

WHEREAS, in calculating the amount to be raised by taxation, the Fire District has taken into account the assessed valuation of taxable property in the Fire District;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District, at an open public meeting held on December 4, 2019 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the Fire District's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District will consider the Annual Budget for

Resolution Appointing Public Agency Compliance Officer

December 18, 2019

WHEREAS, the Affirmative Action laws of the State of New Jersey, codified at N.J.S.A. 10:5-31 et seq., and the regulations promulgated by authority of those laws, N.J.A.C. 17:27, provide contract language and reporting procedures for entering into procurement, service, and construction contracts; and

- The Board Clerk shall, beginning at the December 2020 Board meeting, and at every second meeting in December thereafter, bring forward a resolution to formally designate the District's PACO for the next calendar year.

The Board Clerk shall, immediately upon approval of this resolution, and prior to January 10th of each year, notify the Department of the Treasury, Division of Public Contracts Equal Employment Opportunity Compliance, by use of the attached form, of the identity of the District's most recently designated PACO.
