WHEREAS, the Annual Budget for the Toms River Fire Commissioners District No. 2 (the "Fire District") for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020 has been presented before the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District at its open public meeting of December 4, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the budget as introduced is in compliance with the Property Tax Levy Cap Law (N.J.S.A. 40A:4-45.44 et. seq.) [Include the following as appropriate: [includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$_______ in excess of the allowable amount to be raised by taxation][includes a proposed public referendum in the amount of \$______ as an appropriation from restricted fund balance to be used as budget revenue]]; and

Such amount shall be equal to the amount of the total appropriations set forth in the budget minus the total amount surplus and miscellaneous revenues set forth in the budget; and

WHEREAS, in calculating the amount to be raised by taxation, the Fire District has taken into account the assessed valuation of taxable property in the Fire District;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District, at an open public meeting held on December 4, 2019 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, of the Fire District for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the Fire District's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Commissioners of the Fire District will consider the Annual Budget for adoption on January 15, 2020.

The proposed budget of \$3,419,207 is slightly less than the 2019 budget by \$23,220 or 7/10 of 1%.

Fund Balance Utilized has decreased by \$120,853 or 17.9% from 2019. Interest on Investments and Deposits has increased by \$10,000 or 100% which is more in line with the prior years realized revenue. Capital Appropriations have decreased by \$130,956 or 21.3% from 2019.

The 2020 budget Amount to be Raised by Taxation increased by \$87,633 or 3.2% over the 2019 amount. The local fire tax rate is estimated to be \$0.061 per \$100 of assessed valuation as compared with \$0.060 per \$100 for the 2019 year. The unreserved fund balance utilized for budget years 2020 and 2019 is \$414,000 and \$414,000 respectively. The restricted fund balance utilized for 2020 and 2019 is \$140,893 and \$261,746 respectively. The unreserved fund balance utilized has remained unchanged while the restricted fund balance utilized has decreased by \$120,853 or 46.2%. The District does not anticipate any impact on the following year's budget as its unrestricted fund balance remains sufficient.

ADDENDUM TO N-1, QUESTION #3

The best explanation as to why the 2018 Joint District Appropriation was only 65% expended in 2018, is that items that could have or should have been charged there, were charged elsewhere in the budget. For 2019, the full appropriation appears to have been utilized as per the attached actual vs budget report. However, this figure is an unaudited figure as the 2019 Audit has not yet been commenced. For 2020, the District intends to focus more on allocating expenses to the proper line items.

Supplies increased by 3.3% - Personal Protective Equipment, Rescue Equipment, Tools, Fire Hose and Nozzles, Scott Air Packs, Bottles and Masks. The 2019 Budget was \$194,500, the 2020 Budget was \$201,000, an increase of \$6,500.

Equipment Repairs increased by 3.5% - The appropriation is used to maintain current apparatus and equipment. The 2019 Budget was \$113,500 and the 2020 Budget was \$117,500, an increase of \$4,000.

Health Benefits - Prior to 2020 only one retired commissioner was utilizing the benefits. Since the retirement of a district employees in 2019 who will now be using the benefits package and the hiring of replacement employees who are anticipated to utilize the benefits package, the budget was increased to reflect it.

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.40A:14-68 authorizes the governing body of a municipality to contract with volunteer fire companies within the municipality for the purposes of extinguishing fires, upon such terms and conditions as shall be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.40A:14-81 provides the Commissioners of a fire district with the same powers, duties and functions within the fire district and to the same extent as municipalities relating to the prevention and extinguishment of fires and the regulation of fire hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Fire District #2 in the Township of Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey have negotiated an agreement with the fire company within its jurisdiction upon terms that are fair and proper for the provision of fire protection services to the fire district;

It is on this 21st day of March, 2019, between the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of Toms River, County of Ocean, New Jersey (hereinafter called Commissioners) and Pleasant Plains Fire Dept. (hereinafter called Fire Company), and in consideration of the payment to be made as herein described and the exchange of mutual promises, represented and agreed as follows:

- 1. Fire Company will extinguish fires within the fire district or in such other areas or territories as may be contracted for by Commissioners, or pursuant to mutual aid agreements which have been approved by Commissioners. Copies of all such contracts or agreements shall be furnished to Fire Company. For purposes hereof, the term "extinguishing fires" shall be used in its broadest and most universal sense.
- Nothing herein shall be construed to increase any liability on the part of the Fire Company to the public for errors or omissions in the performance or non-performance of its duties hereunder or pursuant to any other requirement.
- The fire fighter members of the Fire Company, in performing fire duties shall be deemed to be exercising a governmental function.
- 4. The fire fighter members of the Fire Company shall be under the supervision and control of the Commissioners, and Fire Company may not take any action which is contrary to law or to the by-laws or to the official actions of Commissioners. Commissioners shall exercise supervision and jurisdiction over Fire Company in firematic matters only and will not interfere with or seek to regulate the internal administration of Fire Company. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize Commissioners to direct the actions of the fire officials or fire fighters at a fire scene or to act contrary to the statutory command authority of the fire chief at the fire scene.
- Fire Company shall perform such other duties, directly or indirectly related to the extinguishment of fires, as may be reasonably assigned from time to time by Commissioners.
- 6. In addition to the payment to be made annually by Commissioners to the Fire Company pursuant hereto, Commissioners shall provide workers' compensation insurance coverage for all fire fighters of the Fire Company and liability insurance coverage for the Fire Company and for its apparatus, vehicles and equipment but not for the firehouse or other structures owned by Fire Company. Copies of all liability and workers' compensation insurance policies shall be furnished to Fire Company.
- 7. Commissioners shall reimburse fire fighters for any losses or expenses incurred while engaging in fire duty, subject to reasonable proof of the value of such losses, in accordance with procedures to be established by Commissioners, except for those losses or expenses for which reimbursement shall be provided by Fire Company, e.g., clothing allowance, and except for such losses as are covered by insurance.
 - 8. Commissioners shall pay Fire Company \$105,879 for the period from March 21, 2019 through

March 4, 2020 as reimbursement for the expenses of providing fire protection for the fire district. Said payment shall be made in installments of \$3,992 per month; together with two lump sum payments: one at the first meeting in August in the amount of \$2,750 and the other at the first meeting in November in the amount of \$55,225. The latter installment payment of \$55,225 shall be disbursed upon receipt of hose tests, hydrant tests and the list of fire fighter percentages (drills and attendance). The testing of the hose must be done between April 15th and October 15th; the mutual aid drill must be held between April 15th and October 15th; and the annual inspection must be held between April 15th and October 15th. With regard to the funds distributed for the annual Firemen's Convention in Wildwood, New Jersey, the following must be adhered to: 1. Personnel wishing to participate in the parade must help in preparing the truck prior to it leaving for Wildwood, 2. All personnel participating in the parade will do so in uniform (Summer, full dress, etc. as decided by the lead Company from Toms River Township), 3. All expenses for fuel, tolls, and meals while in route issued by the Board will be for those who ride down to Wildwood on the truck, 4. The remaining monies will be distributed equally among all personnel that participate in the convention, 5. No money will be allotted if no truck goes to participate in the parade. Commissioners may request submission of check books or other records or documents to substantiate the compliance of Fire Company with the requirements of this agreement as to all expenditures made of the annual payment aforesaid, provided that if not fully satisfied with such information Commissioners may require an audit of the accounts of Fire Company as to such expenditures, but this in no way obligates the Fire Company to submit to an audit as to any funds received other than from Commissioners. The expense of such audit shall be borne by Commissioners. Fire Company shall cooperate completely with Commissioners and its designated representatives in the conduct of any such audit.

- 9. No contract with any other municipality or fire district for the extinguishment of fires, no mutual aid agreement and no rule or regulation or bylaw relating to same may be adopted without furnishing Fire Company an opportunity for hearing and discussion.
 - 10. For purposes of this agreement, fire fighters shall include "fire police".
- 11. Fire Company will house any apparatus, vehicles or equipment furnished by Commissioners in a safe and secure manner, will observe any rules or regulations promulgated by Commissioners for the maintenance, storage and use of said apparatus, vehicles, and equipment and shall utilize same only in accordance with procedures established by Commissioners and to effectuate the purposes of this agreement. Such rules and regulations shall be in writing and shall be furnished to Fire Company.
- 12. This contract is contingent upon adequate funding being provided in the annual budget as approved by the voters or the municipal governing body, as the case may be.
- 13. Fire Company may not hire or employ any person to perform any function of firematics without the consent of Commissioners, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, but the Commissioners may provide paid employees for use by Fire Company provided that the requirements of L. 1979, c. 453 and subsequent amendments, if any, are observed.
- 14. If any article, section, paragraph, sentence or clause of this agreement is determined to be invalid, same shall be deemed severable and the remainder of the agreement shall survive unless such invalidated language is material to the purposes and intentions of this agreement.
- 15. It is further agreed that this agreement shall be automatically renewable from year to year unless either party notifies the other by written notice of at least 60 days prior to the expiration of this agreement of the intent not to renew. Automatic renewal of this agreement does not constitute, however, acceptance by either party of the prior fiscal year's monetary agreement payable to the fire company, negotiation of which shall continue during the period of automatic renewal until an equitable sum is agreed upon, at which time the agreement shall be so amended. At least 90 days prior to the expiration of this agreement, the Commissioners shall meet with the designated officials of the fire company to determine and set the dollar amount of the agreement and/or make necessary alterations and amendments to said agreement.

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Toms River Fire District No. 2 is in need of various first aid services concerning the volunteer firemen responding to the scene of a fire; and

WHEREAS, the Pleasant Plains First Aid Squad is desirous of providing said services pursuant to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed between the parties as follows:

- 1. When the fire district is dispatched to a fire scene, the first aid squad shall respond to the fire scene with appropriate ambulance and crew for the purpose of providing first aid services to the fire district volunteer fire fighters at the scene. The only fire incidents to which first aid shall respond is structural fires, extrications, second alarm fires, and when otherwise requested by the fire district.
- 2. The fire district shall receive from the first aid squad, quarterly and at year-end, written reports setting forth the total number of responses and the number of responses by each of the first aid members responding to each fire incident.
- 3. The fire district shall have the right to request and receive from first aid a year-end audit relative to the monies paid hereunder.
- 4. The first aid squad shall receive \$5,000 for providing the services set forth herein. The first aid squad shall submit a voucher to the fire district for review and approval by the fire district in order to receive the appropriate monies.
- 5. The term of the agreement shall be for one (1) year from the date of the execution of the agreement and shall continue on a year-to-year basis unless either party submits in writing a letter seeking to terminate the contract at its year-end anniversary.

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, N.J.S.40A:14-68 authorizes the governing body of a municipality to contract with volunteer fire companies within the municipality for the purposes of extinguishing fires, upon such terms and conditions as shall be deemed proper; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.40A:14-81 provides the Commissioners of a fire district with the same powers, duties and functions within the fire district and to the same extent as municipalities relating to the prevention and extinguishment of fires and the regulation of fire hazards; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of Fire District #2 in the Township of Toms River, Ocean County, New Jersey have negotiated an agreement with the fire company within its jurisdiction upon terms that are fair and proper for the provision of fire protection services to the fire district;

It is on this 21st day of March, 2019, between the Commissioners of Fire District No. 2 in the Township of Toms River, County of Ocean, New Jersey (hereinafter called Commissioners) and Silverton Vol. Fire Company (hereinafter called Fire Company), and in consideration of the payment to be made as herein described and the exchange of mutual promises, represented and agreed as follows:

- 1. Fire Company will extinguish fires within the fire district or in such other areas or territories as may be contracted for by Commissioners, or pursuant to mutual aid agreements which have been approved by Commissioners. Copies of all such contracts or agreements shall be furnished to Fire Company. For purposes hereof, the term "extinguishing fires" shall be used in its broadest and most universal sense.
- 2. Nothing herein shall be construed to increase any liability on the part of the Fire Company to the public for errors or omissions in the performance or non-performance of its duties hereunder or pursuant to any other requirement.
- 3. The fire fighter members of the Fire Company, in performing fire duties shall be deemed to be exercising a governmental function.
- 4. The fire fighter members of the Fire Company shall be under the supervision and control of the Commissioners, and Fire Company may not take any action which is contrary to law or to the by-laws or to the official actions of Commissioners. Commissioners shall exercise supervision and jurisdiction over Fire Company in firematic matters only and will not interfere with or seek to regulate the internal administration of Fire Company. Nothing herein contained shall be deemed to authorize Commissioners to direct the actions of the fire officials or fire fighters at a fire scene or to act contrary to the statutory command authority of the fire chief at the fire scene.
- Fire Company shall perform such other duties, directly or indirectly related to the extinguishment of fires, as may be reasonably assigned from time to time by Commissioners.
- 6. In addition to the payment to be made annually by Commissioners to the Fire Company pursuant hereto, Commissioners shall provide workers' compensation insurance coverage for all fire fighters of the Fire Company and liability insurance coverage for the Fire Company and for its apparatus, vehicles and equipment but not for the firehouse or other structures owned by Fire Company. Copies of all liability and workers' compensation insurance policies shall be furnished to Fire Company.
- 7. Commissioners shall reimburse fire fighters for any losses or expenses incurred while engaging in fire duty, subject to reasonable proof of the value of such losses, in accordance with procedures to be established by Commissioners, except for those losses or expenses for which reimbursement shall be provided by Fire Company, e.g., clothing allowance, and except for such losses as are covered by insurance.
 - 8. Commissioners shall pay Fire Company \$115,875 for the period from March 21, 2019 through

March 4, 2020 as reimbursement for the expenses of providing fire protection for the fire district. Said payment shall be made in installments of \$4,825 per month; together with two lump sum payments: one at the first meeting in August in the amount of \$2,750 and the other at the first meeting in November in the amount of \$55,225. The latter installment payment of \$55,225 shall be disbursed upon receipt of hose tests, hydrant tests and the list of fire fighter percentages (drills and attendance). The testing of the hose must be done between April 15th and October 15th; the mutual aid drill must be held between April 15th and October 15th; and the annual inspection must be held between April 15th and October 15th. With regard to the funds distributed for the annual Firemen's Convention in Wildwood, New Jersey, the following must be adhered to: 1. Personnel wishing to participate in the parade must help in preparing the truck prior to it leaving for Wildwood, 2. All personnel participating in the parade will do so in uniform (Summer, full dress, etc. as decided by the lead Company from Toms River Township), 3. All expenses for fuel, tolls, and meals while in route issued by the Board will be for those who ride down to Wildwood on the truck, 4. The remaining monies will be distributed equally among all personnel that participate in the convention, 5. No money will be allotted if no truck goes to participate in the parade. Commissioners may request submission of check books or other records or documents to substantiate the compliance of Fire Company with the requirements of this agreement as to all expenditures made of the annual payment aforesaid, provided that if not fully satisfied with such information Commissioners may require an audit of the accounts of Fire Company as to such expenditures, but this in no way obligates the Fire Company to submit to an audit as to any funds received other than from Commissioners. The expense of such audit shall be borne by Commissioners. Fire Company shall cooperate completely with Commissioners and its designated representatives in the conduct of any such audit.

- 9. No contract with any other municipality or fire district for the extinguishment of fires, no mutual aid agreement and no rule or regulation or bylaw relating to same may be adopted without furnishing Fire Company an opportunity for hearing and discussion.
 - 10. For purposes of this agreement, fire fighters shall include "fire police".
- 11. Fire Company will house any apparatus, vehicles or equipment furnished by Commissioners in a safe and secure manner, will observe any rules or regulations promulgated by Commissioners for the maintenance, storage and use of said apparatus, vehicles, and equipment and shall utilize same only in accordance with procedures established by Commissioners and to effectuate the purposes of this agreement. Such rules and regulations shall be in writing and shall be furnished to Fire Company.
- 12. This contract is contingent upon adequate funding being provided in the annual budget as approved by the voters or the municipal governing body, as the case may be.
- 13. Fire Company may not hire or employ any person to perform any function of firematics without the consent of Commissioners, which shall not be unreasonably withheld, but the Commissioners may provide paid employees for use by Fire Company provided that the requirements of L. 1979, c. 453 and subsequent amendments, if any, are observed.
- 14. If any article, section, paragraph, sentence or clause of this agreement is determined to be invalid, same shall be deemed severable and the remainder of the agreement shall survive unless such invalidated language is material to the purposes and intentions of this agreement.
- 15. It is further agreed that this agreement shall be automatically renewable from year to year unless either party notifies the other by written notice of at least 60 days prior to the expiration of this agreement of the intent not to renew. Automatic renewal of this agreement does not constitute, however, acceptance by either party of the prior fiscal year's monetary agreement payable to the fire company, negotiation of which shall continue during the period of automatic renewal until an equitable sum is agreed upon, at which time the agreement shall be so amended. At least 90 days prior to the expiration of this agreement, the Commissioners shall meet with the designated officials of the fire company to determine and set the dollar amount of the agreement and/or make necessary alterations and amendments to said agreement.

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, Toms River Fire District No. 2 is in need of various first aid services concerning the volunteer firemen responding to the scene of a fire; and

WHEREAS, the Silverton First Aid Squad is desirous of providing said services pursuant to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is agreed between the parties as follows:

- 1. When the fire district is dispatched to a fire scene, the first aid squad shall respond to the fire scene with appropriate ambulance and crew for the purpose of providing first aid services to the fire district volunteer fire fighters at the scene. The only fire incidents to which first aid shall respond is structural fires, extrications, second alarm fires, and when otherwise requested by the fire district.
- 2. The fire district shall receive from the first aid squad, quarterly and at year-end, written reports setting forth the total number of responses and the number of responses by each of the first aid members responding to each fire incident.
- 3. The fire district shall have the right to request and receive from first aid a year-end audit relative to the monies paid hereunder.
- 4. The first aid squad shall receive \$5,000 for providing the services set forth herein. The first aid squad shall submit a voucher to the fire district for review and approval by the fire district in order to receive the appropriate monies.
- 5. The term of the agreement shall be for one (1) year from the date of the execution of the agreement and shall continue on a year-to-year basis unless either party submits in writing a letter seeking to terminate the contract at its year-end anniversary.
