WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, the Governor of the State of New Jersey declared the concurrent invocation of both a State of Emergency pursuant to N.J.S.A. App.A.:9-33 et seq. and a Public Health Emergency as contemplated by N.J.S.A. 26:13-1 et seq., which invoked the authority and powers contemplated by N.J.S.A. 26:13-3, the Emergency Health Powers Act, and remains in effect; and

WHEREAS, on March 13, 2020, the President of the United States declared COVID-19 a national emergency; and

WHEREAS, on March 27, 2020, the Coronavirus Aid Relief and Economic Security Act ("CARES Act") became law and was enacted, amongst other purposes, to combat the economic damages caused to the States and the political subdivisions and instrumentalities under them; and

WHEREAS, the County of Ocean (the "County") has received CARES Act funds from the United States Treasury to be used to reimburse the County, its agencies, municipalities and instrumentalities such as this Fire District, within its boundaries, for economic damage attributed to the COVID-19 pandemic and the State of Emergency/Public Health Emergency; and
